Ribbon Cutting Ceremony and Tour - Thursday, October 3, 2019
Tour Policy, Procedures and Safety Requirements/Precautions

The Georgetown Divide Public Utility District is pleased to provide an opportunity for interested individuals to see the new Auburn Lake Trails Water Treatment Plant in operation. We hope tour participants will gain a better understanding of the work the District does to provide the public with clean, high quality water.

In general, the tour will cover the major treatment processes that drinking water goes through—from primary treatment to final treatment, as well as analytical testing performed in the laboratory and State water quality requirements and reporting. The tour will describe the process a drop of water goes through in the treatment process.

Please be advised that the tour will occur during normal operations; access to facilities will be limited.

Waiver and Release of Liability Form. Tour participants must be at least 18 years of age and willing to sign a Waiver and Release of Liability form. (Forms will be available at the registration table. Be sure to get a green sticker on your name tag to confirm your signed release form is on file.)

Safety Requirements/Precautions. There are safety requirements that everyone touring the plant must be willing and able to adhere to or they will not be allowed into the plant operations area. There are some dress requirements and protective equipment that will be required during the tour.

- Personal Protective Equipment:
 - Sturdy closed shoes that are ankle high, like sneakers (no flip-flops, sandals, clogs, open toes shoes, or heels).
 - Long pants (no shorts or skirts).
 - Hard hats will be provided.
- Safety Precautions:
 - Stay with tour group at all times.
 - Watch for overhead hazards or objects protruding from walls.
 - Be aware of liquid on the floors that may cause a slip hazard.
 - Do not touch equipment – may be in operation.
 - Do not lean on or over railings or tanks.

ADA Accommodation.
